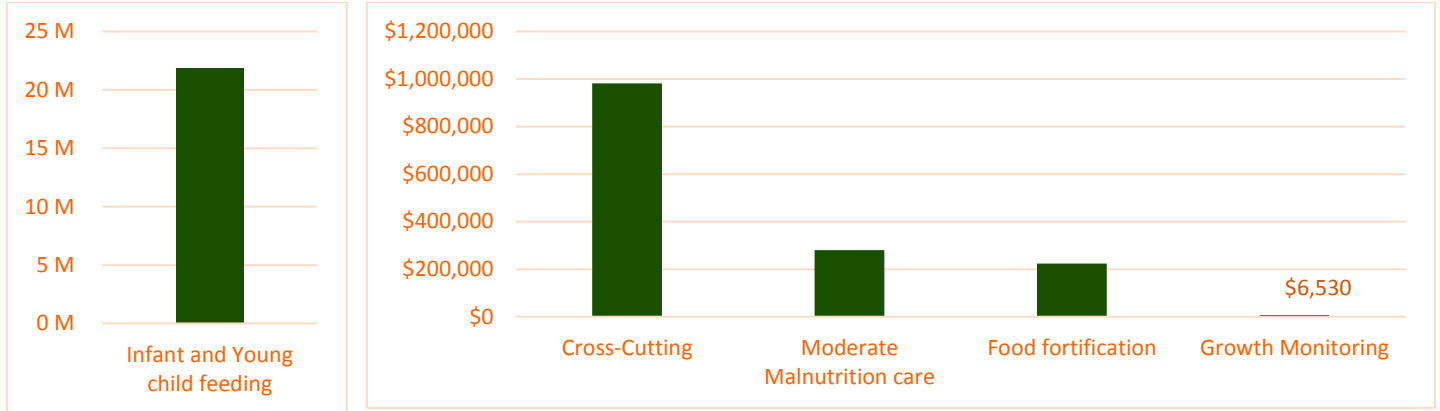
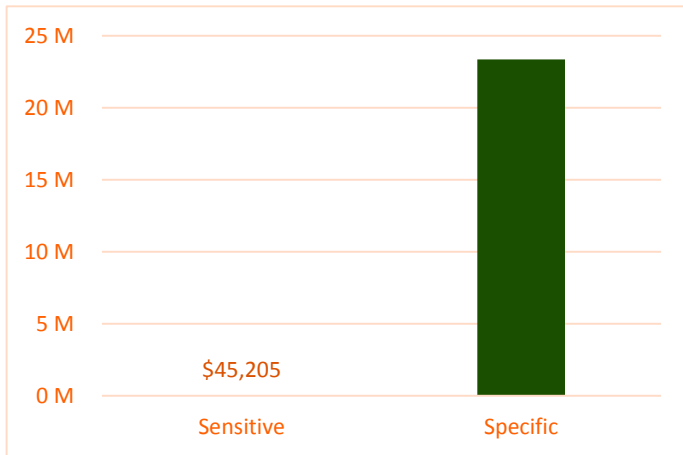

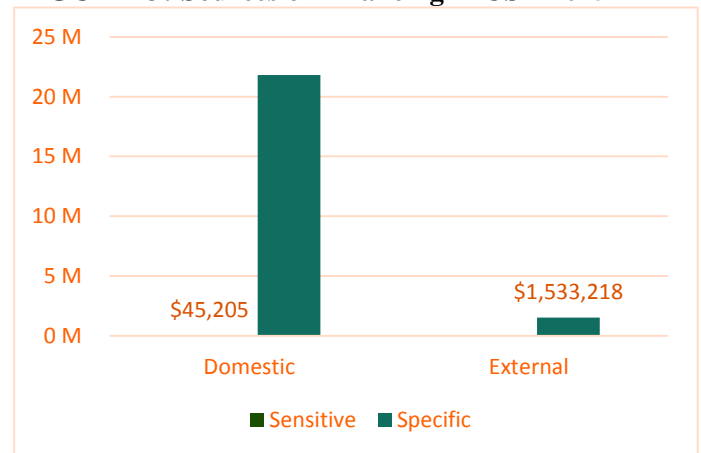
**FIGURE 1: Nutrition Relevant Allocations Across High-Impact Nutrition-Specific Interventions in USD 2015**



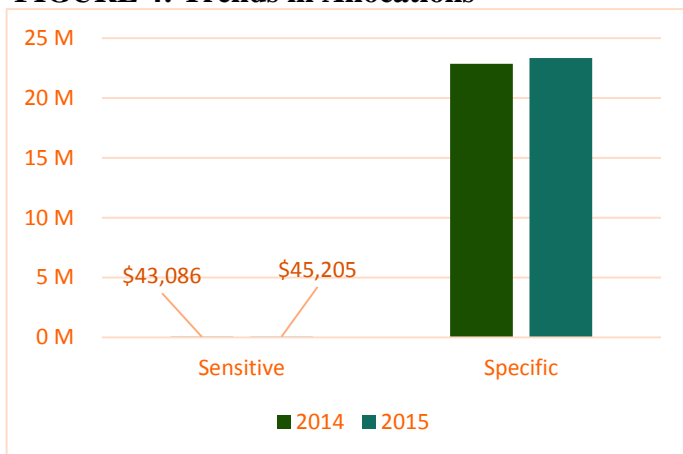
**FIGURE 2: Nutrition Specific and Nutrition Sensitive Allocations in USD 2015**



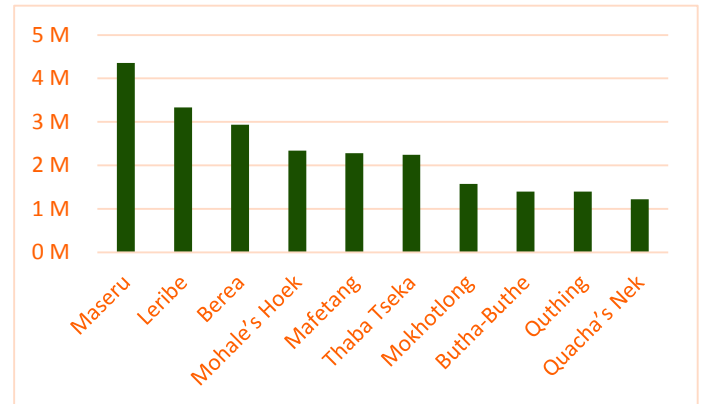
**FIGURE 3: Sources of Financing in USD 2015**

**Explanatory note:**

Lesotho's budgetary structure is aggregated at the level of program implementation where each budget line item represents a nutrition-related program. With this information, the 2015 analysis by Lesotho identifies that allocations for 140 budget line items totaled \$11.15 per-capita and related to four high-impact nutrition-specific interventions and one food-fortification program.

**Figure 1** highlights the budgetary allocation differences between the five different types of high-impact nutrition-specific and food-fortification interventions. Upper-bound estimates identify that allocations for 61 programs related to Infant and Young Child Feeding (including both breastfeeding and complementary feeding) Interventions totaled \$10.44 per-capita. Allocations for 40 programs related to Cross-cutting Nutrition Interventions amounted to \$0.47 per-capita. Allocations for 24 programs related to Moderate Malnutrition Care (including supplementary feeding) Interventions totaled \$0.13 per-capita. Allocations for 8 programs related to Food-Fortification Interventions totaled \$0.11 per-capita. Allocations for 7 programs related to Growth Monitoring totaled \$0.00 per-capita.

**Figure 2** explains that 21 nutrition-sensitive programs totaled \$0.02 per-capita in allocations while 119 nutrition-specific programs accounted for \$11.13 per-capita.

**Figure 3** highlights the differences in upper-bound funding allocations across nutrition specific and sensitive programs. Upper-bound estimates identify that external funding sources allocate \$0.73 per-capita for 78 nutrition-sensitive programs. Conversely, domestic sources allocate \$10.42 per-capita for 41 nutrition-specific programs, and \$0.02 per-capita for all 21 nutrition-sensitive programs.

**Figure 4** identifies that between 2014 and 2015, funding allocations for nutrition-specific programs increased by 2.15% while allocations for nutrition-sensitive programs increased by 4.92%.

**Figure 5** outlines differences in nutrition related allocations across ten districts. Allocations across the ten districts range from \$2.08 per-capita (Maseru) to \$0.58 per-capita (Quacha's Nek), and average \$1.12 per-capita, whereas the number of nutrition-related programs range from 18 (Thaba Tseka) to 6 (Berea), and average 14.
