

# NUTRITION INVESTMENT SNAPSHOT: KYRGYZSTAN



59 countries are leading a global movement to end malnutrition in all its forms.

## SUMMARY TABLE

Kyrgyzstan's budgetary structure is aggregated at the sub-activity level. This means that each budget line item represents a sub-activity of a programme. With this information, the 2016 analysis by Kyrgyzstan identified four programmes with 15 priorities, for a total of 48 activities included in this analysis. Allocations for these 48 sub-activities totalled 10.46 per capita in 2015 (all estimates are in USD).

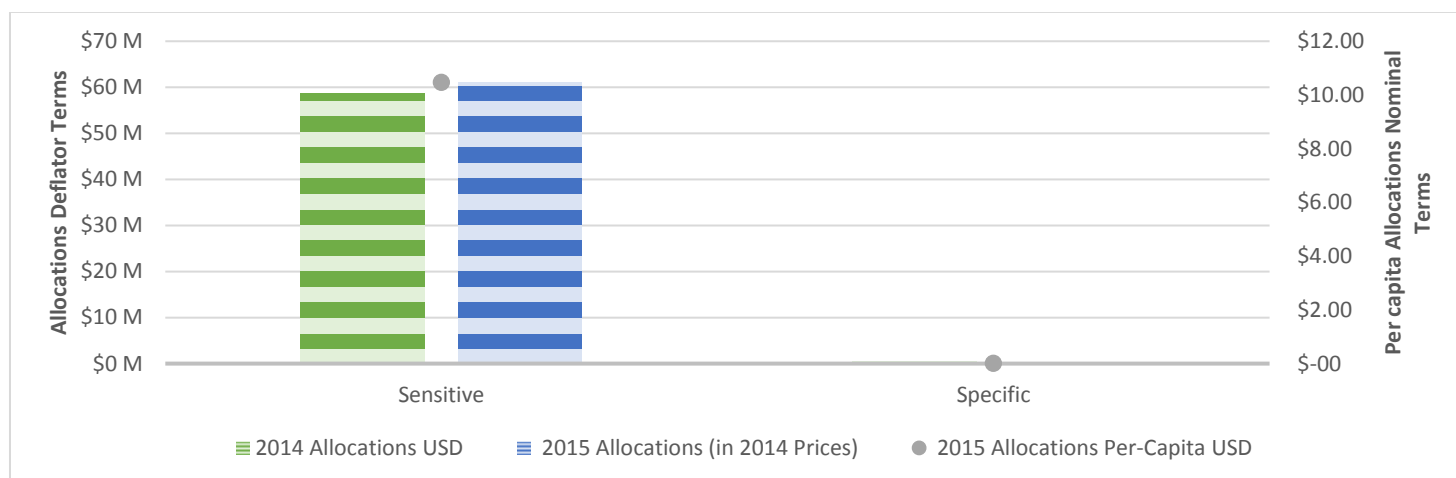
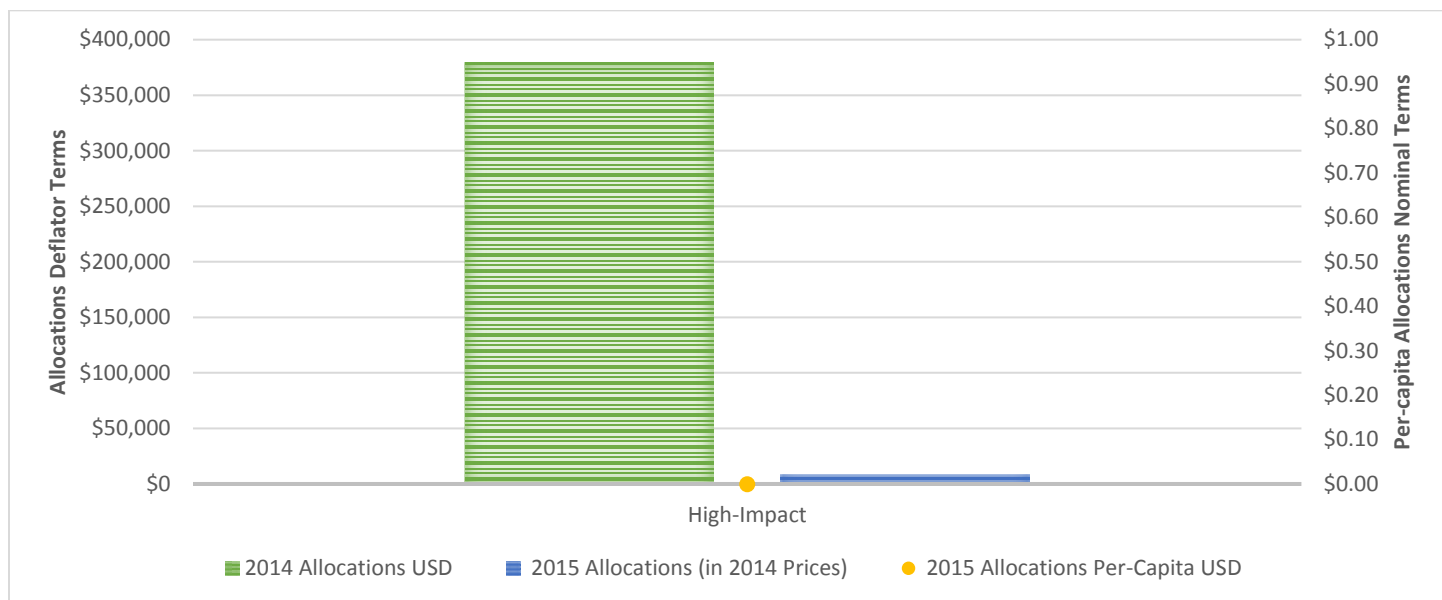

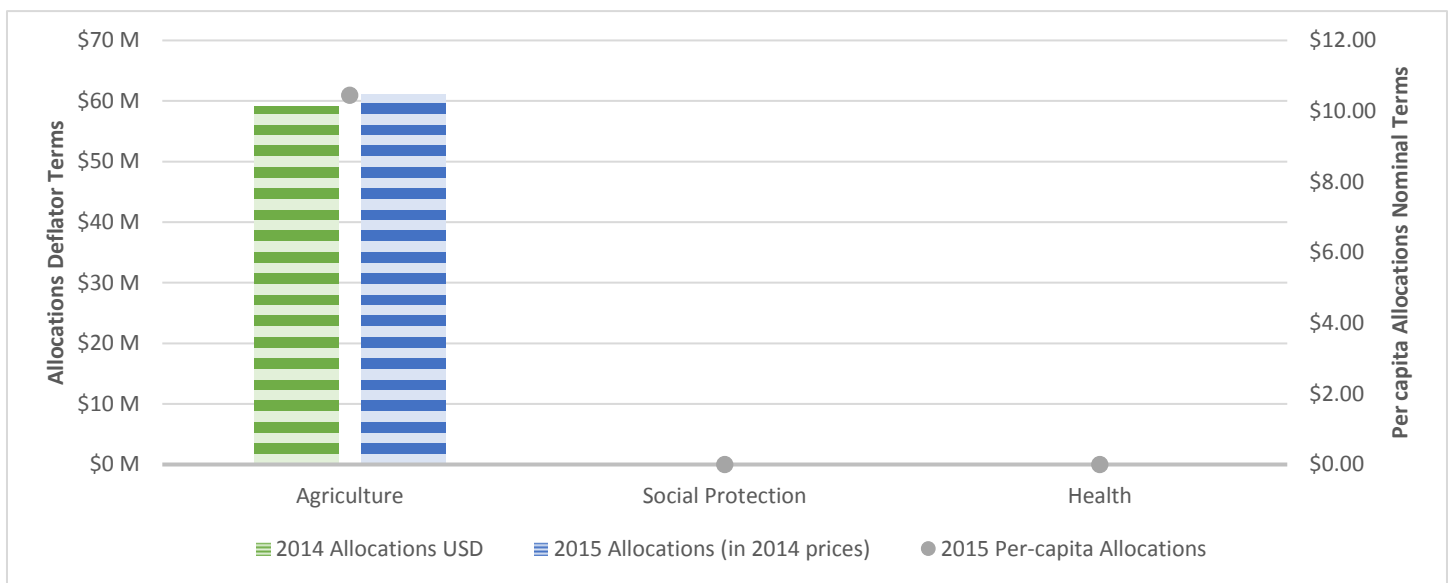

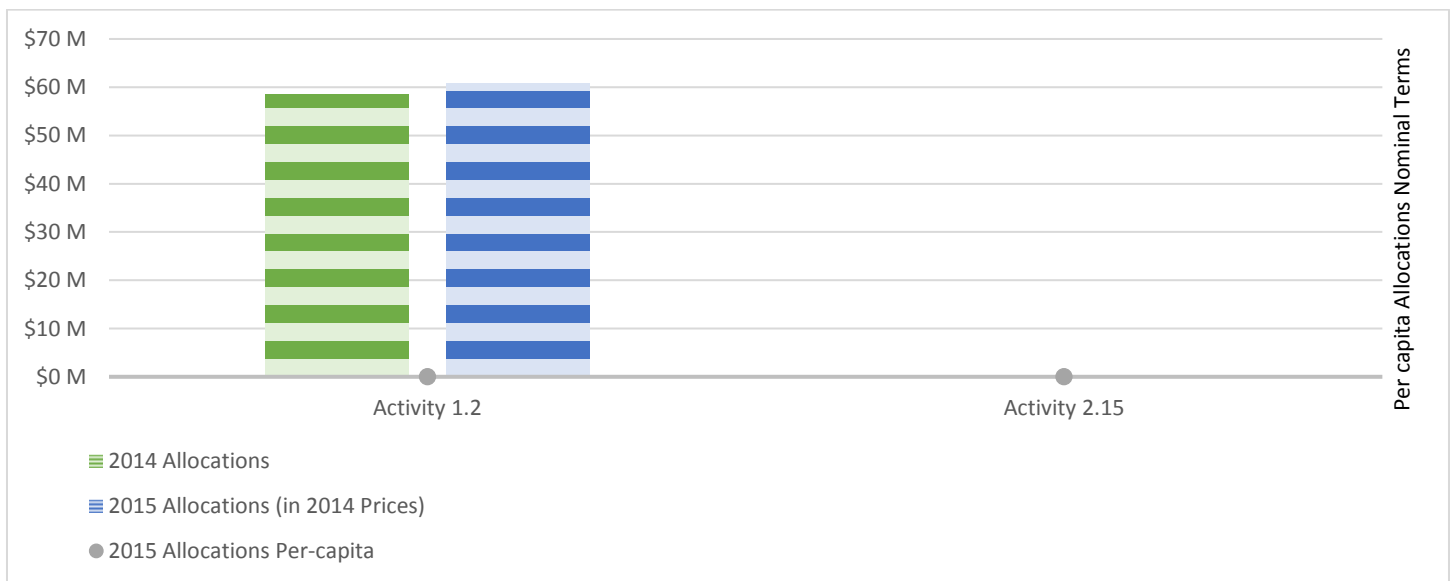
