

# NUTRITION INVESTMENT SNAPSHOT: LIBERIA



59 countries are leading a global movement to end malnutrition in all its forms.

## SUMMARY TABLE

Liberia's budgetary structure is aggregated at the programme level. This means that each budget line item represents a programme. With this information, the 2016 analysis identifies 63 nutrition-relevant programmes, of which 62 programmes received allocations in 2015.<sup>1</sup> The 62 nutrition-relevant programmes are overseen by twenty four ministries, departments and agencies (MDAs), which allocated 51.21 per capita in 2015 (all estimates in USD).<sup>2</sup>

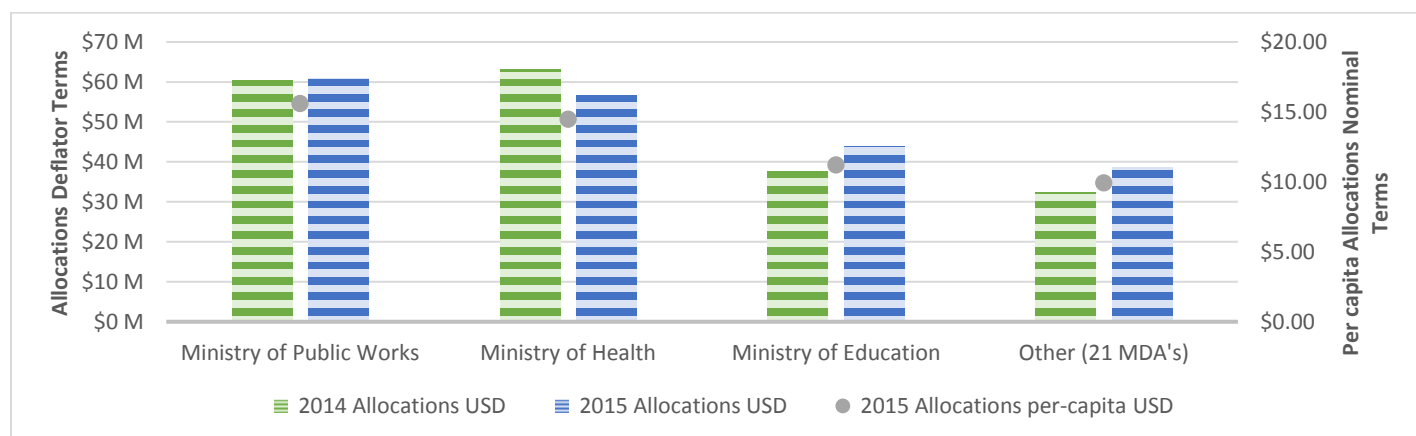

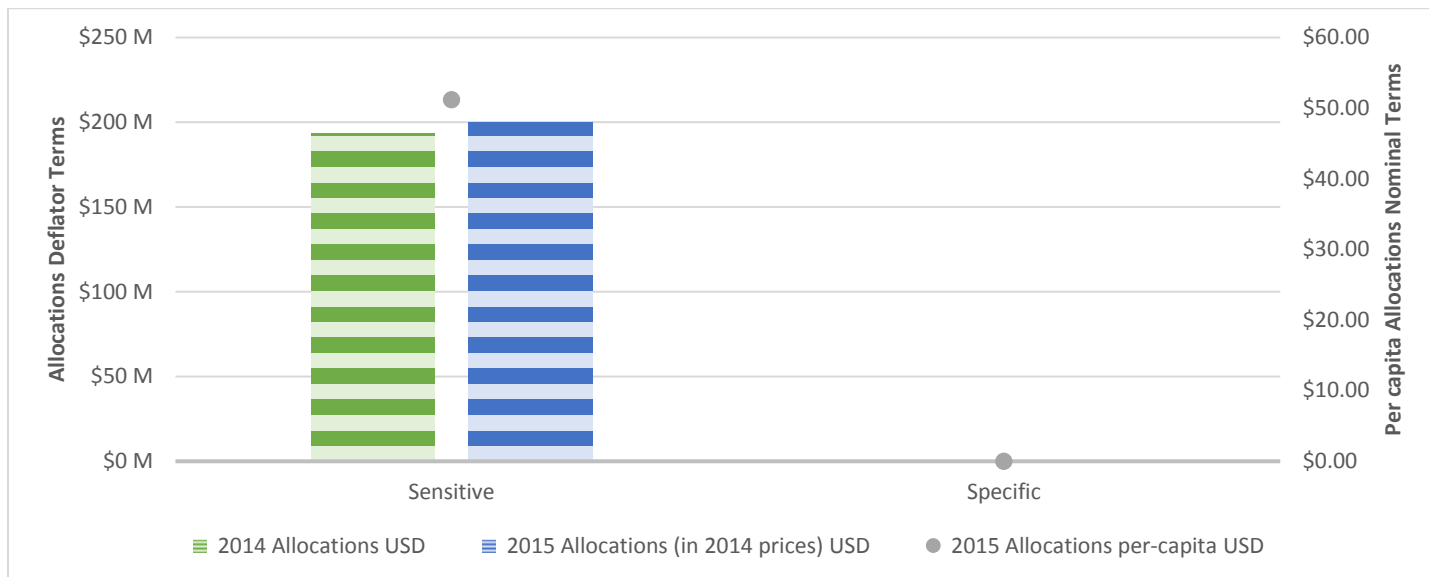

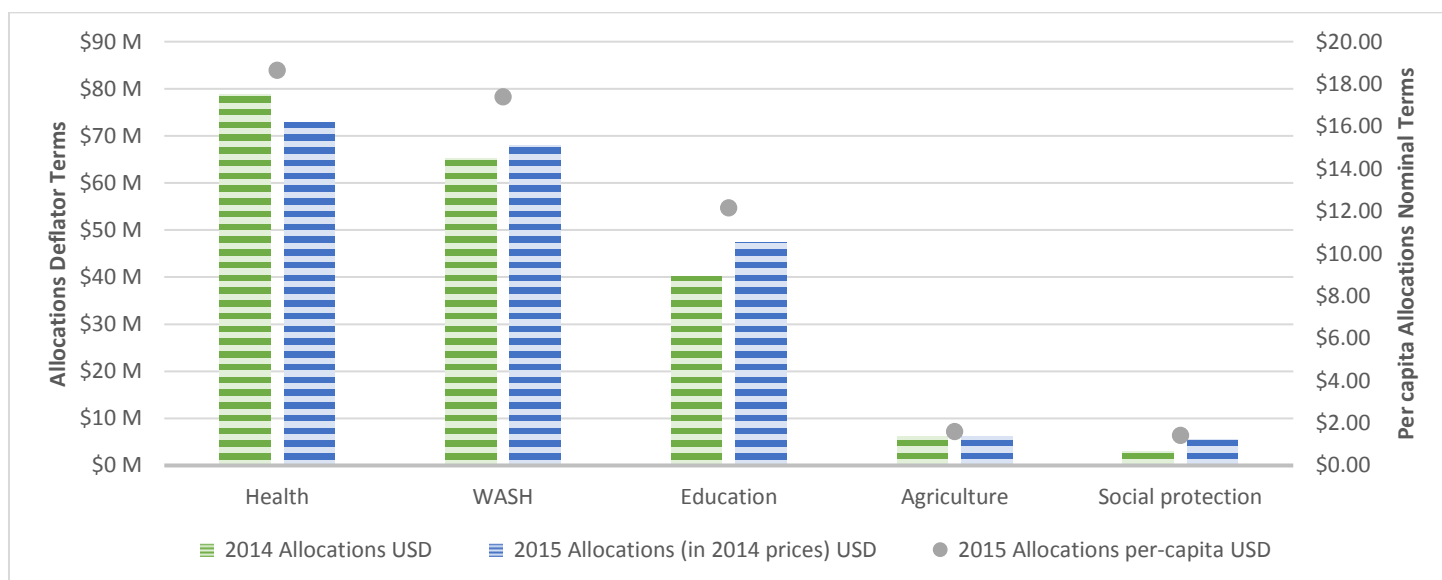

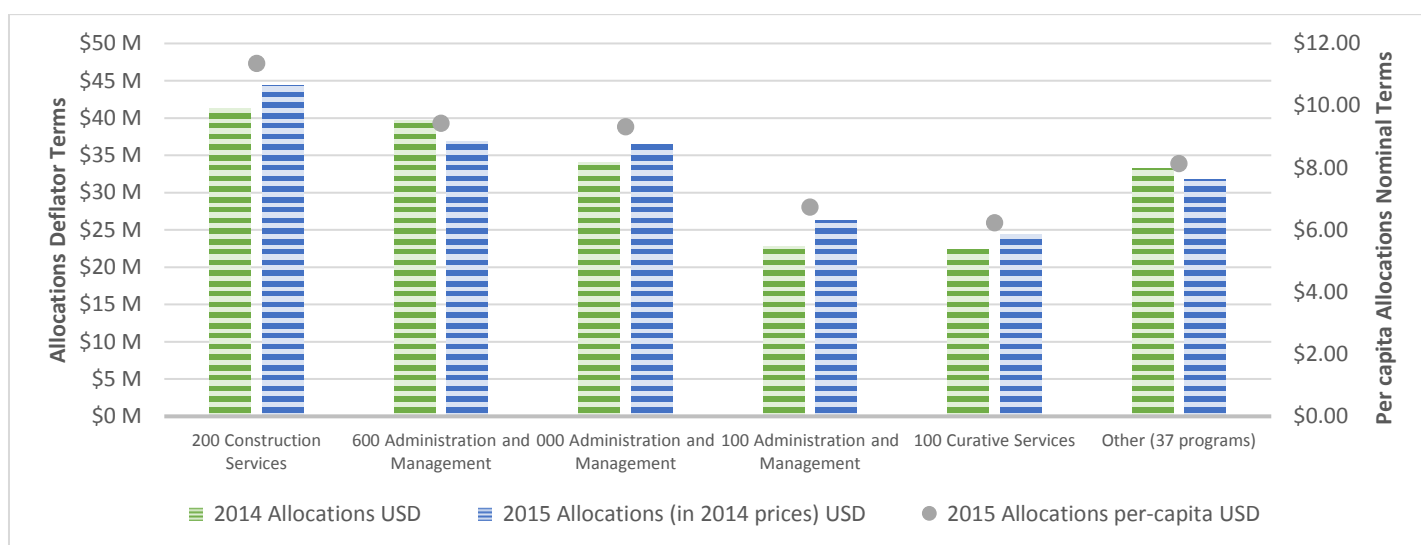
