

NUTRITION INVESTMENT SNAPSHOT: MADAGASCAR



59 countries are leading a global movement to end malnutrition in all its forms.

SUMMARY TABLE

Madagascar's budgetary structure is aggregated at the programme level. This means that each budget line item represents a programme. With this information, the 2016 analysis identifies 71 nutrition-sensitive programmes, of which 44 programmes received allocations and were managed by ten ministries, departments and agencies (MDAs), which allocated 5.69 per capita in 2016 (all estimates in USD).

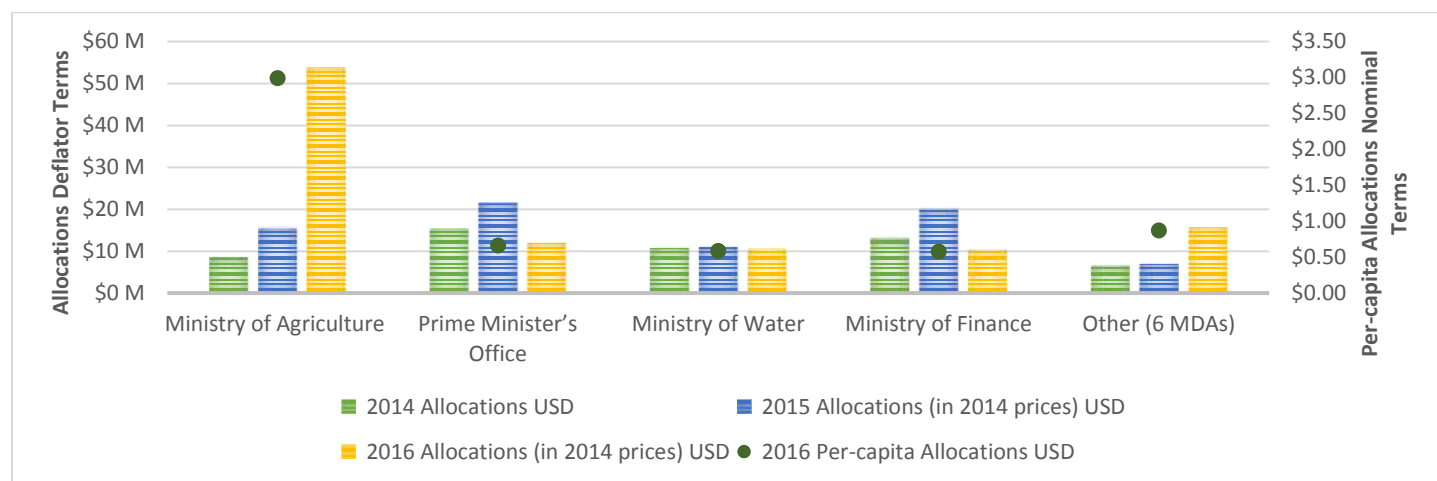

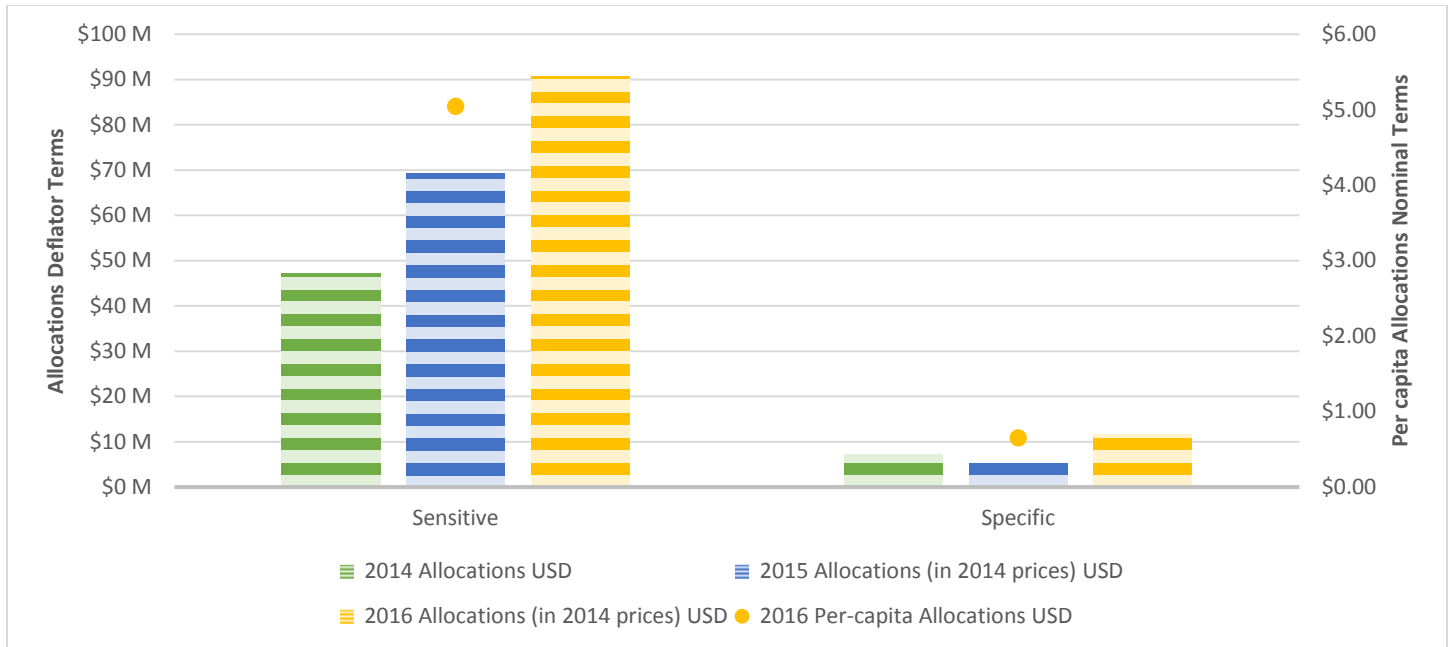

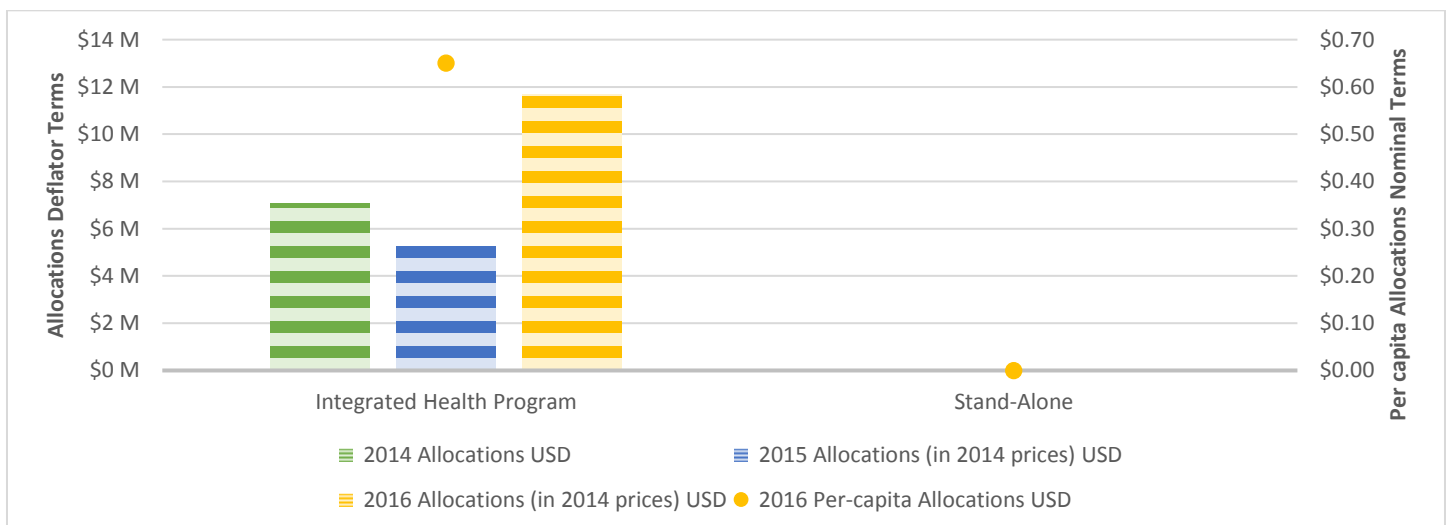
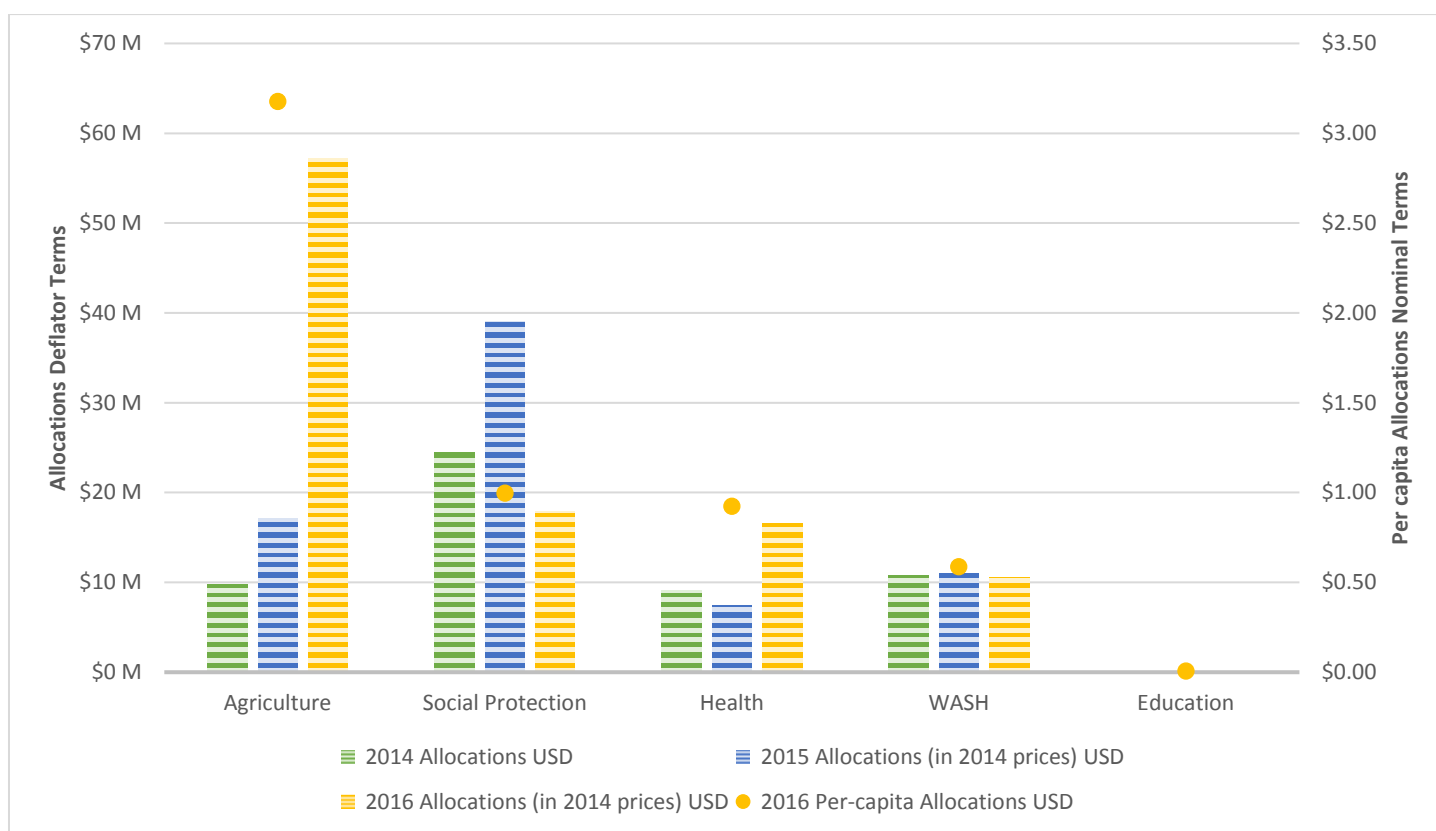

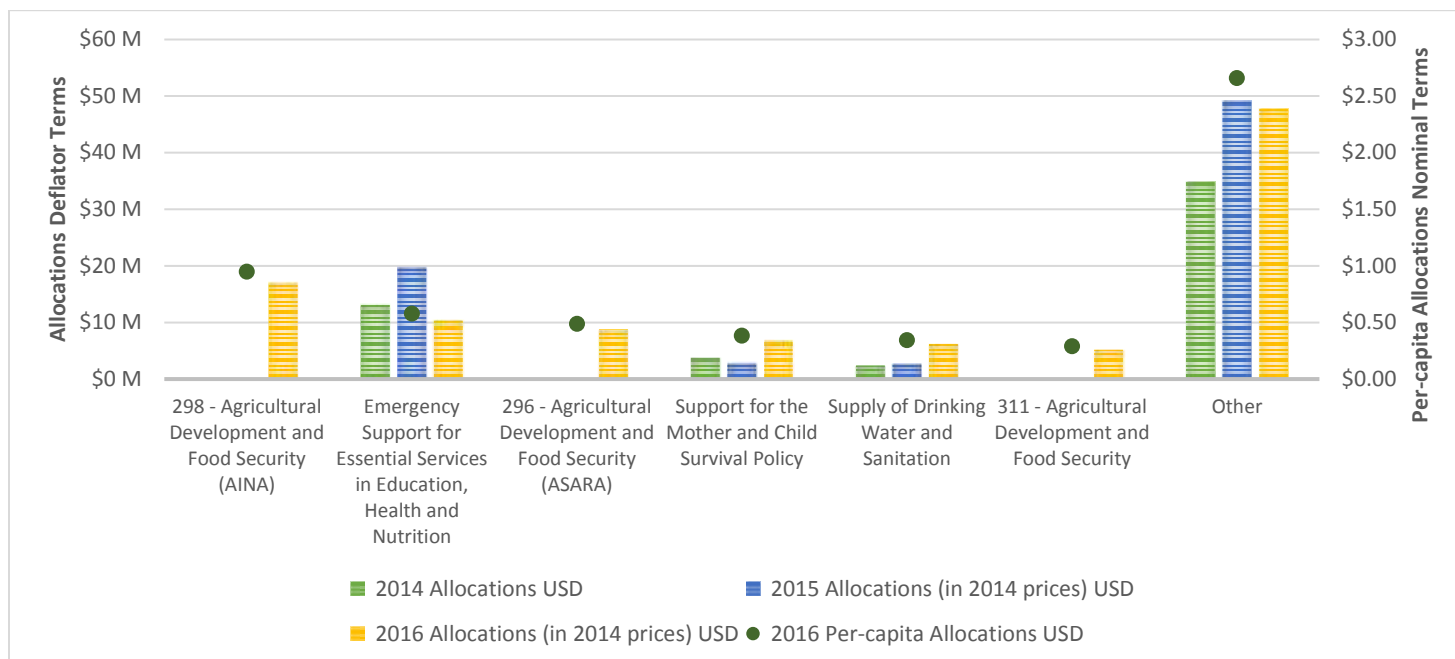
