3.2.6 Early Childhood Development	1	The Government has established national laws and regulations to promote the provision of ECD services. The Draft National Integrated Early Childhood Development Policy (NIECDP) under development is a crucial step towards establishing an effective enabling environment and comprehensive ECD system. Uganda's EMIS collects data on ECE enrollment at the national, regional and district levels through an annual school census. EMIS data differentiate children's access to ECE by age, gender, and special needs. Results generated by this system are being effectively used in monitoring progress and improving education services in the country. Yet, the current system does not currently collect data on access by geographical location (urban/rural), socio-economic background, and mother tongue. While the health and nutrition sectors in Uganda collect child development outcome indicators, data collection within the education, child and social protection sectors are limited to service provision and service provider levels.
